Thank you for participating in the General Nash District 2024 First Aid Meet! We have worked hard to put together an exciting morning of activities and problems to allow you to practice and demonstrate your knowledge of basic first aid skills. These problems are designed to reflect real-world situations you might encounter in your home, at work or school, or during Scouting activities. We hope you have as much fun participating as we have had in preparing for this!

The purpose of this packet is to provide you with the information needed to prepare for the day. In particular, you should find enclosed:

- A Schedule of the day's activities
- Maps for getting to the meet
- A few brief reminders on proper etiquette for using the facilities
- Details on the Meet Logistics Registration, Problems, Scoring, Awards, etc.
- Sample Problems and Score Sheets

We are also asking that ALL UNITS bring their **TROOP/CREW FLAG AND STANDS** with them to this event. We hope to take a large group photo with the unit flags serving as a backdrop. Your help and cooperation with this is appreciated.

It is important that we get your feedback on this event. We need your feedback to identify where we did not meet your expectations, and how it might be improved in the future.

This year's event will be held indoors, in Hyson Hall (the gymnasium) of Trinity Lutheran Church in Lansdale PA. We will follow whatever COVID guidelines and restrictions are in effect for Trinity Church and the Cradle of Liberty Council on that date. All attending will likely be expected to wear a proper face covering / mask. We will be severely limited in what refreshments we might be able to serve – best to bring your own water bottles. Most importantly – bring a positive attitude.

Once again, thank you for participating, and enjoy the day. Scout On!

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The General Nash District 2024 First Aid Meet will be INDOORS in the gymnasium (Hyson Hall) of the Trinity Lutheran Church on West Main Street of Lansdale PA. The event will be held on SATURDAY March 2, 2024. The meet is scheduled to begin promptly at 9:00 AM; check-in will begin at 8:30 AM.

The First Aid Meet is open to Patrols from all troops/crews in the General Nash District. THIS IS A PATROL EVENT. Patrols attending should have a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 8 members. Each Patrol should bring a Patrol First Aid Kit as described in the BSA Handbook.

Patrols will work on 7 structured problems and a written test / "flash card" exercise.

Each will take 15 minutes (2 hours of activities)

#### **MAPS & DIRECTIONS**

Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church is located at 1000 W. Main Street, Lansdale PA 19446. The main parking and entrances are on the Columbia Avenue side of the building. See the road-map towards the back of this packet for directions to get to the facility.

There is ample parking available at the church. If dropping your Scout(s) off, please pull around the "traffic circle" by the main rear entrance. The side hallway entrance to the building *may* also be open.

#### **FACILITY RULES OF ETIQUETTE**

We are fortunate to have the use of these facilities from Trinity Church. Recognizing we are GUESTS, we ask that all those attending be mindful of the following rules of etiquette:

- Please park in designated parking areas only.
- Be respectful of other visitors in the church.
- <u>IF</u> we are able to serve refreshments, this will likely occur OUTSIDE. No food or drink in the Gymnasium.
- This is an INDOOR EVENT we will be subject to current COVID restrictions, which will likely require everyone to wear a mask / face covering. This is non-negotiable.
- Patrol "stations" will be marked on the gym floor as in years past. Each patrol is responsible for bringing a blanket to sit on if they wish. Chairs will be provided for the JUDGES ONLY in each station!

#### **MEET LOGISTICS**

#### Registration

- Patrols should plan to arrive between 8:15 AM and 8:45 AM.
- Patrols should submit a roster of their participants listing names and ages, along with a check or cash for \$9 per participant when they register. A sample Registration Form is attached. Checks should be made out to "COLBSA" (Cradle of Liberty Council). This charge covers facility rental, supplies, Patrol totems, trophies and patches for all participants.
- Each participant will receive a commemorative patch from the event. A limited number of additional patches may also be available for sale at Roundtable. Each Patrol will also receive a "totem" for their patrol flag.
- Patrols that arrive late will be allowed to register. They may have to wait until after the Opening Ceremonies are complete and may therefore miss one or more problems.
- Each Patrol should come with a PATROL FIRST AID KIT, as described in the BSA Handbook, and a WRITING INSTRUMENT. Part of the meet may involve a written test you may want to have a BSA HANDBOOK and FIRST AID MERIT BADGE BOOK handy for reference! Patrols may also wish to bring a blanket or some coats to sit on and to use during the meet.
- Each Patrol will be assigned a "station" location for the meet. They will remain in their assigned location for the duration of the meet (the Judges will rotate).

#### Format of the Meet

- Each patrol will be allowed to answer seven (7) structured problems (hands-on) and complete a written / "flash-card" First Aid Knowledge test (TRUE/FALSE, Multiple Choice).
- Each problem (including the test) will be allotted a 15-minute time-frame. This amounts to approximately 2-hours of First Aid activities for the meet.
- During the 15 minute problem period, one or more "victims" will be designated, the problem will be given, and the Patrol will be asked to demonstrate their solution. Judges will then briefly critique the results of the problem with the Patrol before the next 15-minute period begins.
- Patrol members should take turns as "victims". That is, no patrol member should serve as the victim for two successive problems, and no one should serve as a victim a second time until everyone else in the patrol has been a victim at least once. The victim should be selected BEFORE the problem is read to the Patrol.
- Patrols will be assigned a fixed "station" location; Judges will rotate among patrols to administer a problem.
- To the extent possible, Judges will be assigned a limited number of problems (ideally only one) which they will administer throughout the meet. This will ensure consistency in scoring. Judges will be given one "solution sheet" per patrol on which they will mark the results of their evaluation.
- We attempt to recruit Judges with medical backgrounds (EMT, nursing, etc.). They
  will be able to provide additional insight into the problems based on their personal and
  professional experience. However, FIRST AID KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED FOR
  BSA RANK ADVANCEMENT (Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class) AND
  THE FIRST AID MERIT BADGE ARE THE PRINCIPLE SOURCES USED IN THIS
  MEET (limited information from the BSA Fieldbook, Wilderness First Aid course, and
  Emergency Preparedness MB may also appear).
- Additional Judges will be recruited as needed on the day of the meet. No special training is required; score sheets for each problem will be supplied. We encourage any adult able to stay for the meet to volunteer as a Judge. Additional volunteer opportunities are also available, such as score-collectors, kit inspectors, 9-1-1 Operators, patch counters and the like. Please encourage your parents to help!
- All Judges are VOLUNTEERS. They are doing their best and offering their time to help us practice and improve our First Aid Skills. Please extend your thanks and appreciation to our Judges for helping make the day a success!
- Some problems may require additional supplies (e.g. splint material) which are not normally included in a Patrol first aid kit. These will be made available in a central area at the meet ("supply depot"). Materials borrowed for a problem must be returned before next problem period begins!

#### Awards & Recognition


- Each participant will receive a patch. We expect these will be available the day of the meet.
- Each Patrol will receive a participation "Totem" to hang on their Patrol Flag
- The Patrols with the top 3 scores will be awarded a Trophy.
- The Patrol demonstrating consistently effective teamwork will be awarded a "Terrific Teamwork" trophy
- The two top-scoring Patrols from among those with the lowest average age of participants will be awarded "Top Finisher Jr. Division" trophies.

#### **Uniforms**

- All Scouts and Scouters should wear full Class "A" / BSA Field Uniforms to the event.
- Neckerchiefs often come in handy for First Aid problems!!
- We will be visible and in the public eye ... Let's LOOK SHARP!
- All units are asked to please BRING YOUR TROOP/CREW FLAG AND FLAG STAND! We will be attempting a large "group photo" and will use the flags as a backdrop.

His pupils have shrunk, his breathing is very noisy and he is slipping in and out of consciousness. What do you do?
